Refugee Resettlement - your help is needed!

Catholic Charities Archdiocese of Dubuque is currently resettling a Tanzanian refugee family of five in Cedar Rapids. This family has spent the last 11 years in a refugee camp awaiting their legal resettlement to the United States. The mother of these four children, ages 13, 11, 9 and 6, was widowed earlier this year. The family arrived in Cedar Rapids with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

Providing adequate support and meeting basic needs for this family will take many months as the mother learns job skills, the entire family learns English and they adjust to the American culture. Catholic Charities will be with this family providing case management, mentorship and support but we need your support for this family. The Office of Migration and Refugee Services provides minimal financial support for this family that will only last a couple of months. To ensure this family, and others are provided with the best possible opportunity to acclimate in our country, we ask that you prayerfully consider making a donation to our refugee resettlement program to ensure this family has adequate resources to pay for rent and utilities once an appropriate apartment/house can be located. Make donation payable to Catholic Charities and mail to: Archdiocese of Dubuque, Finance Office, 1229 Mount Loretta Ave. Dubuque, IA 52003. Please state: "Refugee Resettlement" in the memo of your donation. 100% of all donations will go directly to assist refugee families.
