Stewardship June 6th

In today's Gospel, the disciples suggest that Jesus disperse the crowd so that they might individually seek food and lodging. The miracle of the feeding of the five thousand is Jesus' powerful reminder that when we share our gifts in His name there is always more than enough!

Our Roman Missal has a new translation approved:

The Vatican has formally approved a new English translation of the Roman Missal. It will be a while before the approved texts can be prepared by publishers, musicians etc. for our use. In the last forty years we have all adopted /or memorized several prayers where changes in the wording will probably cause us some frustration as we relearn our prayers. Some examples of changes to come are: when the priest says: "The Lord be with you" or "The peace of the Lord be with you always" our current response to both is: "And also with you." In the future, we will pray: "And with your spirit"

Words in the Gloria and Creed and other parts of the Mass will also have changes. Our U.S. Bishops' conference has not announced when the changes will take place. Since most of our churches buy missalettes, songbooks etc. at the beginning of each church year it would seem that the very earliest in which publishers could have all the new translations in their publications might be Advent of 2011. Maybe that guess is much sooner than composers and suppliers will be able to accomplish all that needs to be done.

There will be some changes in the readings from the lectionary (the book with the various readings) as well as the book, we currently call the sacramentary. (The red book servers hold for Father at the opening prayer). With the changes, this book will be called the Roman Missal. If we think we will find the adjustment hard, imagine what it will be for the celebrant! For those of us in the pews, common prayers we pray together, and various congregational responses, will likely be the most difficult. These changes came from a 2001 instruction from the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. One key passage in that document says: "The translation of the liturgical texts of the "Roman liturgy is not so much a work of creative innovation as it is of rendering the original texts faithfully and accurately into the vernacular language. In this change there is a high priority to more literal translation from the Latin.

Those involved in planning liturgy have attended a meeting last year about the changes. As summer news is often brief, I will write more on this topic in the days ahead.
