Traditionally the Trinity is called a "mystery", a reality beyond our understanding. Jesus' farewell discourse, Jn. 13-17, contains many references to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Let us try to be conscious of the Trinity references in the liturgy, especially the Doxology concluding the Eucharistic prayer, "through him, with him, and in him" The Sign of the Cross is a significant Trinitarian prayer, when prayed deliberately and reflectively. The Gloria sung on most Sunday's and Feast's is a tremendous prayer of praise to all three persons. Our "Glory Be" is another beautiful prayer to the Trinity.

Today's Psalm reminds us that we have been crowned with glory and honor and given rule over the works of God's hands. But we must be good stewards, for the Lord will surely hold us accountable for the use of those gifts!

For Children: One good way to express our gratitude to God (and to increase our awareness of things we need to be grateful for) is to take a few moments during grace before and after meals or during prayer with the children at night to thank God for something specific that happened during the day – going to the park, play time with friends, a birthday party, etc....
